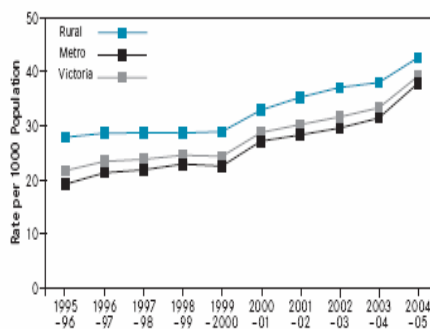
## Care in your community & Ambulatory Care
